Welcome to the fifth edition of the Gothenburg Fringe.

It's difficult to put into words how we are feeling ahead of this year's Gothenburg Fringe, following six months of uncertainty, disappointment, determination, hope and finally excitement.

Like every aspect of society, the performing arts world has taken a number of painful blows this year, with performances postponed and cancelled, support lacking, motivation dropping and uncertainty taking hold as artists around the world scrambled to make the most of a dire situation.

When the Fringe movement began in the 1940s, it was born in the wake of a worldwide crisis and evolved to become a community with over 200 festivals around the world. What more inspiration do we need to kick our asses into gear and bring you a Fringe, in the safest way possible, and treat you to some delightful shows.

While the majority of festivals have focused solely on streaming during this time, we felt going down that route would not serve anything of real value to the local community – so we pushed ahead with a smaller-scale, fully local Gothenburg Fringe.

While the concept of Fringe theatre is still relatively new in Gothenburg, the interest from local talent in taking part is a testament to the work done in recent years and the festival's increased reputation.

We are incredibly excited and proud to use the Fringe as a platform for rising and established performers from Gothenburg and the Västra Götaland region to showcase their talent and potentially begin a journey into the Fringe community which can take them around the world.

As is the case every year, there is something for everyone at this year's event - all ages, all tastes and languages. Although all of the acts are based here, there is a fine mixture of performances in Swedish and English, we even have a show in Spanish!

You'll find specific information for each and every performance within this programme, which should whet your appetite for some great shows on 3-6 September. Not sure what to see? Well, choose a show that looks good to you, ask a volunteer or friend to recommend one and then select one totally at random – that is an ideal way to get the true Gothenburg Fringe experience.

Uncertainty is a bit of a theme in this text and understandably so, but there are a couple of things we are certain of. We are certain you're going to enjoy the Fringe we're bringing you this year, certain that the local artists performing will be thrilled by your support and belief in their work and certain that our brand of uncensored, heartfelt and genuine performance art will grow stronger as we move past this global health crisis.

What is the Fringe?

If you are about to experience our festival for the first time this year, you are in for a treat. Gothenburg Fringe is an explosion of creativity, featuring uncensored, cutting-edge performance art which stimulates, educates and entertains.

This year's Fringe will feature 36 performances across four days in seven venues around Gothenburg.

A key feature of this year's festival is our tagline 'The city is our stage' and we are taking that claim very seriously, by complementing our more traditional theatre venues with unique and unexpected spaces.

On pages 5-13 you can see an overview of the performances on offer, with everything from music to dance, improv to immersive theatre and everything in between.

The vast majority of performances take place from Friday 4 September to Sunday 6 September, with a special opening evening planned for Thursday evening, which you can read about on Page 4.

Gothenburg Fringe's COVID-19 strategy

Our action plan for a safe and enjoyable Fringe

2020 began the same as any other year, but the world has drastically changed in recent months. The culture industry has taken a particularly big hit as artists have lost their audience and the public has lost their arts.

We believe in the need for laughter, emotions and thought-provoking performance. In 2020, we think it's more important than ever to strengthen the arts and local community to give us relief from the loneliness, fear and boredom which has come as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. We believe this is possible to do in a safe way as long as we work together and adapt to the situation.

How do we adapt?

- We have decided to invite artists only living within the Västra Götaland region going local.
- Collaborating with fewer and well-established venues
- Fewer performers/groups
- Increased level of social distancing, hygiene and digitalisation
- · Limited audience, never exceeding 50 people

Artists

Due to the uncertainty surrounding international travel and the various stages of reopening in different countries, we decided to reschedule the bookings of artists outside Västra Götaland for later dates and focus on local artists on 3-6 September.

Venues

Together with our venue partners, we are forming Corona-safe strategies for each venue. Several of them have not had activities for the last couple of months and are very much open to discuss how to make the venue as safe as possible.

We have collaborated with all of our venues to create safe routing and seating plans. At each venue, we have included a one-hour timeslot without audience or performers in between the performances in order to make sure audiences do not enter or exit the venue at the same time and to set aside enough time to clean the venue before and after each show.

With the vast majority of this year's performances taking place at indoor venues, we can make each event ticketed and ensure the audience number does not exceed the recommended limit, which is not as easy to do with outdoor public gatherings.

In previous years, Gothenburg Fringe has made police applications for events in public space, but that is not applicable this year.

Audience

Tickets will be 100% digital this year, with pre-booking available as well as the option to purchase at the door using Swish, ensuring no physical contact is necessary. For the audience, artists and volunteers, it's important for all to have access to alcogel and soap in the toilets.

In advance of the performances, we will ensure clear communication with the audience, volunteers and artists about safety guidelines - safety information will be sent to all ticket holders in advance and there will be written and verbal advice given at the venue.

At the entrance to each venue, we will have a volunteer on hand, as well as markings on the ground, to ensure social distancing.

Volunteers

All volunteers will be offered masks, gloves and pocket alcogels in the interest of everyone's safety. They will be briefed on our safety procedure and inform all audience members of the necessary information before each performance.

Information

Gothenburg Fringe's core organisational team has met, discussed and agreed upon the adaptation strategies. These will then be transferred to all volunteers who have signed up for supporting Gothenburg Fringe this year. In each venue, we will also place a folder with information regarding the restrictions and regulations. Each volunteer and organizer will also sign a paper confirming that they have read and understood the information.

Marketing towards audiences has always contained a reminder of not leaving your home if you are feeling sick.

What if someone gets sick during the festival?

We will inform volunteers and artists that they must cancel their participation if they have symptoms.

In the event of someone being diagnosed with COVID-19, we will take action in terms of considering cancelling the festival depending on which and how many people the person has interacted with. The core team will then discuss the procedure in consultation with 1177.

Risk Analysis

We have used Folkhälsomyndighetens (Public Health Authority) risk assessment document in order to plan a safe festival. The risk analysis can be read in full on our section dedicated to the COVID-19 action plan on gothenburgfringefestival.com.







Today the theatre is run by the independent theatre group of the same name, Hagateatern, and every year at least two performances premiere. It is a space for guest performances, seminars, debates, readings and much more.
